
About Us

Important Fire Information





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

Waroona is more than just a stop - it's a place where quiet charm, rich history, and beautiful art come together, just waiting to be uncovered and explored.

Start your journey in the heart of town at the Waroona Visitor Centre, where local knowledge meets local talent. Inside, you'll find maps, travel tips, and a rotating display of vibrant artworks and handcrafted pieces from artists across the region. It's the perfect first stop to plan your adventures - and maybe take home a little piece of Waroona too! Also, be sure to stop right out front of the Visitor Centre and take a selfie with Mooriel, Australia's best dressed cow!

Railside Park is a vibrant green space in the heart of Waroona's town centre, just off the South Western Highway. This beautifully designed community hub offers something for all ages, with a skatepark, pump track, and two engaging playgrounds featuring an interactive water channel and heritage-style Dethridge wheel. Visitors can relax in the peaceful Noongar "Six Seasons" garden, enjoy shady picnic lawns, explore striking public art, and make use of the BBQs, restrooms, and drinking fountains. With ample parking and space for RVs, it's an ideal spot to stretch your legs, enjoy lunch, or let the kids burn off energy. Whether you're passing through or planning a staycation, Railside Park is a must-visit destination for families and travellers exploring Waroona and beyond.







If you're keen to explore further afield, take a short drive to Lake Clifton, home to one of the world's rarest natural phenomena: the thrombolites. These living rock-like microbial structures are estimated to be over 2,000 years old and provide a glimpse into some of the earliest forms of life on Earth. A boardwalk allows for safe viewing over the lake, and interpretive signage offers insights into their fragile ecosystem.





Waroona also takes pride in preserving and sharing its local history. The Heritage Bush Poles, scattered across the Shire, form a unique trail of local storytelling and creativity. Unveiled in the year 2000, these hand-carved poles feature striking imagery, including a kangaroo, trout, crab, marron, drake, dairy cow, red-tailed black cockatoo, Aboriginal landscapes, a water skier, and even a hand gripping a spanner to symbolise the local workforce. Each pole was created by members of the community, many of whom had never picked up a chisel or paintbrush before. Can you find them all?

Step back in time at Drakesbrook Antiques, a beloved local treasure and the largest single Moorcroft retailer in the world.

Nestled in the heart of Waroona, this fascinating store is packed with rare collectibles, gifts, rustic homewares, and unique curios from every era. You'll find something to spark your curiosity - especially among the stunning display of world-renowned Moorcroft pottery. Every corner holds a story, and you're invited to uncover it.

Art and Heritage Trail

Begin at the Waroona Visitor Centre at 37 South Western Highway, Waroona

Beginning at the Waroona Visitor Centre, the Art and Heritage Trail is like a living scrapbook of the town's heart and soul. Wander through the streets and uncover colourful murals, public sculptures, and historic buildings that tell the stories of pioneers, community heroes, and everyday life in the region. Trail maps are available from the Visitor Centre, but half the fun is stumbling across unexpected pieces of art as you go!

Centennial Park

22 De Hamel Street, Waroona

Centennial Park is a welcoming space that brings people together. Whether you're letting the kids burn off some energy or just enjoying the sunshine, this park is a great place to pause and recharge. With public toilets and barbecue areas available, it's the perfect spot to make up that on-the-go picnic you've been planning! It's also a frequent place for coffee vans and food trucks to set up, so you might get lucky and not have to cook at all!





Drakesbrook School Memorial Footprint

22 De Hamel Street, Waroona

Once the site of Waroona's original schoolhouse, this peaceful memorial marks the footprint of the old classroom with a simple but moving design. Surrounded by native plants and historical signage, it's a quiet space to honour the community's early dedication to learning and a beautiful stop on your stroll through town. Public toilets are also nearby at the beautiful Centennial Park, so why not view a piece of history from the peace of the park?



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Magic Barn Fairy Garden & Fairy Door Trail

Whimsy comes alive at the Magic Barn Fairy Garden, a delightful little nook where fairy homes and enchanted creatures hide among the flowers. You'll find handmade treasures, gifts, sweet treats, and plenty of fairy flair. Pick up a trail map and continue the fun by spotting dozens of tiny fairy doors hidden throughout town (the largest Fairy Door Trail in Western Australia!)

Hamel Eco Park

This rustic eco park offers a peaceful pocket of nature along Burney Road, Hamel. Shaded by century-old trees from Western Australia's first State Nursery, the park has a quiet charm where natural heritage and history gently intertwine.

Though weathered by time, the park remains a fascinating place to explore featuring interpretive signs, a small creek, and numerous bush tucker plants, including a rare cork tree. It's a dog-friendly spot ideal for curious travellers, bushwalkers, or anyone wanting a quiet stop off the highway.





Heritage Bush Poles

Waroona's Heritage Bush Poles are more than just art - they're hand-carved stories standing tall. Spread across Waroona, Hamel, Preston Beach, and Lake Navarino Holiday Park, each pole was crafted by members of the local community, many of whom had never carved or painted before. The carvings reflect local industries and wildlife - from trout and marron to mining tools and red-tailed black cockatoos. Keep an eye out as you explore - can you spot them all?

Lime Kiln

Off Newnham Road, Lake Clifton

A true piece of history - the remains of an original lime kiln that was part of the Western Australian Portland Cement Company's lime project that operated between 1919 and 1923. The lime kiln is one of the only remaining structures from the former townsite of Lake Clifton, which was developed as a company town by the Cement Company in 1920. About 100 metres into the walk is the 'talking circle', flanked with wooden seating and six stunning artworks that represent the six Noongar seasons by local artists Gloria and Karrie-Anne Kearing.

Railside Park

95 South Western Highway, Waroona

From the thrilling pump track and skatepark to the enchanting junior playground and fenced toddler play area, there's something for everyone in this 11,500 sqm wonderland. Immerse yourself in the Noongar Six Seasons Garden and picnic area. It also features a range of community-contributed artworks, mosaics, and the Dethridge wheel water feature. With amenities such as shade, electric BBQ, benches, water fountain, and a toilet block, your visit is sure to be comfortable and enjoyable. Lake Clifton Thrombolites

Mount John Road, Herron

Hidden within Yalgorup National Park, the thrombolites of Lake Clifton are one of the world's rarest natural wonders - ancient, living rock-like structures that offer a glimpse into Earth's earliest days. Estimated to be over 2,000 years old, they form the largest thrombolite reef in the southern hemisphere. A scenic boardwalk lets you get up close to these formations, especially between January and May when water levels are low. Interpretive signage explains their incredible biological and cultural significance, making this a truly unforgettable stop.



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Waroona Historical Society

Corner of South Western Highway and Millar Street, Waroona Open Sundays 10:00am - 12:00pm or by appointment

Located in the former Drakesbrook District Road Board Office, the Waroona Historical Society is a volunteer-run organisation dedicated to preserving the stories, artefacts, and identity of the region. Their small museum houses a fascinating collection of letters, diaries, photos, and memorabilia that reflect the community's past and help shape its future. It's a must-visit for history lovers and curious minds alike.

Waroona Visitor Centre

ADVENTURE



If you're looking to stretch your legs, chase the horizon, or just feel the wind in your hair, Waroona is the perfect base for a good old-fashioned adventure. From paddling and picnics to high ropes and horsepower, adventure lives here and it's yours to enjoy.

Just a short drive from town, Drakesbrook Weir is a favourite with locals and visitors alike. Its calm waters invite you to paddle out in a kayak, cast a fishing line, or leap from the pontoon with a splash. Shady trees and grassy banks make it the perfect picnic spot, with barbecues ready to go. The nature playground is watched over by Clawed, the resident giant marron statue who's always camera ready.







Drakesbrook Weir is also home to the annual Waroona Troutfest, held on the middle weekend of the October school holidays - a popular celebration of freshwater fishing, family fun, and environmental stewardship. Focused on sustainability, Troutfest includes the annual release of brown and rainbow trout into the waterway, helping to support healthy fish populations for the future. Drakesbrook Weir is a must-visit destination for all ages - cool off in the water, explore the trails, or just enjoy a picnic by the water.



From peaceful strolls to adrenaline-pumping climbs, the Shire of Waroona is home to an exciting range of trails waiting to be explored. Whether you're hiking through jarrah forest, mountain biking across rugged terrain, or simply taking in the views on a lakeside walk, there's something here for every adventurer. Many trails connect with local attractions and can turn your trek into a full day of discovery.

ADVENTURE





4WD

Off Mitchell Road, Preston Beach

Get off the beaten track at Preston Beach, one of the few beaches in Western Australia where you can legally drive right onto the shoreline. Preston Beach offers kilometres of open coast to explore - whether you're fishing, picnicking, or chasing the perfect sunset. It's a favourite spot for locals and visitors alike, with plenty of space to find your own patch of paradise. Just remember to check the tides, let down your tyres, and respect the natural environment!

Mountain Biking

The Shire of Waroona is a great place to bring your bike. With plenty of open spaces, local paths, and bushland trails to explore, there's no shortage of spots to get rolling. For something a little more challenging, check out the brand-new pump track at Railside Park in Waroona. Designed for all ages and skill levels, it's the perfect place to test your balance, build confidence, and burn off some energy. So grab your helmet, round up your mates, and get pedalling!





Camping

If you're looking to unplug and reconnect with nature, the Shire of Waroona offers some of the best camping spots in the region. Head to Martin's Tank Campground in Yalgorup National Park for peaceful bush surrounds, easy access to Preston Beach, and well-maintained facilities nestled among peppermint woodlands. Within the Jarrah forest, Lane Poole Reserve offers a variety of riverside campgrounds beneath towering trees - ideal for swimming, hiking, and toasting marshmallows under the stars. Whether you're bringing a tent, trailer, or camper, you'll find the perfect spot to soak up the serenity. Bookings are essential for most campsites, so plan ahead for your next outdoor escape!





Canoeing

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Paddle your way through nature in the Shire of Waroona, where serene rivers and calm waters make for unforgettable canoeing and kayaking adventures. Gliding through forest-lined streams or drifting across open water - there's something incredibly peaceful about exploring the region by paddle. The Drakesbrook Weir is a fantastic launch spot for a relaxed day on the water, with clear, still conditions perfect for beginners and families. For something larger, the Waroona Dam (Lake Navarino) offers more open space to explore, surrounded by towering trees and native bushland. Bring your own canoe or kayak and discover the waterways at your own pace - just don't forget your life jacket!

Drakesbrook Weir

Weir Road, Waroona

A local favourite and hidden gem, Drakesbrook Weir is the perfect spot for a day of relaxation, recreation, and water-based fun. This scenic freshwater spot is ideal for swimming, canoeing, kayaking or jumping off the pontoon! You'll find free gas barbecues, shaded picnic tables, a large grassy area, nature playground, and a giant marron statue named 'Clawed', who's always up for a photo. Drakesbrook Weir is a must-visit for visitors of all ages. Please note dogs are not allowed on the grassed area, but welcome on the foreshore!





Fishing

Whether you're an experienced angler or just tossing in a line for fun, the Shire of Waroona offers some top-notch fishing spots surrounded by beautiful natural scenery. Cast your line at Drakesbrook Weir or Waroona Dam (Lake Navarino), where the calm waters are ideal for catching rainbow trout, redfin perch, and even marron during the season (with the proper permits!) Prefer the coast? Preston Beach is just a short drive away and offers great beach fishing, with tailor, herring, and whiting often on the catch list. Need bait, tackle, or expert advice? If you're after some new gear or just after a tip on what's biting, That Fishing Shop In Waroona has you covered. Don't forget your freshwater fishing license!

ADVENTURE





Pump Track and Skate Park

Railside Park, 95 South Western Highway, Waroona

At Railside Park, you'll find an action-packed pump track and skate park built for bikes, boards, scooters, and skates - great for all ages and skill levels. The pump track features a smooth loop of rollers and berms that riders can flow through using momentum, no pedaling required. Right next door, the skate park combines street and flow elements with ramps, rails, and ledges designed for creative lines and big tricks. The layout is beginner-friendly but offers plenty of challenge for experienced riders, and the whole space is accessible and inclusive.

Horse Riding

Saddle up and explore the Shire of Waroona from a whole new perspective! With plenty of scenic trails, quiet country roads, and open spaces, this region is a fantastic place to bring your four-hooved companion for a ride. Whether you're trotting through bushland or taking in rolling farmland views, there's something peaceful and grounding about experiencing Waroona on horseback. New to riding? Head to Langford Hill Riding Farm - a friendly, family-run property offering riding lessons and experiences for all skill levels. It's a great place to learn the basics, build confidence in the saddle, or simply enjoy the company of these beautiful animals.





Skiing & Wakeboarding

Craving some high-speed fun on the water? Waroona Dam (Lake Navarino) is the place to be! With plenty of open space, calm mornings, and stunning surrounds, the dam is a popular destination for jet skiing, water skiing, and wakeboarding. Whether you're showing off tricks behind a wakeboard or cruising across the surface on a jet ski, it's the perfect spot to get your adrenaline fix. Boats and jet skis are welcome at the dam - just be sure to follow all signage, observe local safety rules, and respect other water users. Please note that these activities are not permitted at Drakesbrook Weir, which is reserved for non-motorised watercraft and swimming.





Trails

The Shire is full of scenic trails and hidden gems just waiting to be discovered. Take on the Fairy Door Trail, a fun and magical journey for all ages. Wander through wetlands on the Hamel Wetlands Trail, or head to Preston Beach and listen for the elusive call of the noisy scrub bird - there are heaps of trails to choose from! Many trails are dog-friendly (on a leash), with options for casual walkers and keen hikers alike. Pick up the Shire of Waroona Trails Guide, stop by the Waroona Visitor Centre or visit our website for maps, tips, and trail highlights - then get out there and see where the path takes you.

Treetop Adventures

Soar through the forest canopy and test your nerves at Treetops Adventure Dwellingup - an unforgettable experience filled with flying foxes, swinging bridges, and high ropes challenges suspended high above the forest floor. With courses for all skill levels (including kids!), it's a thrilling way to connect with nature while pushing your limits. Surrounded by towering jarrah trees and the tranquil Murray River, it's the perfect setting for a high-flying adventure in the Shire of Waroona. Bookings are essential, so secure your harness and get ready for adventure!





Waroona Dam



There are two dedicated RV locations in the Shire of Waroona - Recreational Vehicles (RV) must be a caravan, bus, coach or similar that is designed and used for recreational use that are fitted with:

- an operable integrated blackwater waste system with a holding tank; and
- a greywater waste system that is capable of capturing greywater without it being deposited on the ground. An integrated holding tank is not required.

Maximum Stay: 48 hours Number of RVs not to exceed number of marked bays



Please note the following conditions apply:

- is prohibited.
- Greywater waste must be disposed of off-site
- RV use, camping or operating vehicles on other areas of reserves is prohibited
- Camp or cooking fires prohibited at all times
- RV use and camping in areas other than these sites The time frame between one period of stay and the next period by the same RV is 5 consecutive nights
 - Erecting a fixed annex is not permitted
 - Clotheslines external to an RV are not permitted
 - Accessing any power outlet is not permitted





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
